Where is the best place to put this kind of mic? (For instance, at the listener's seat? At the front of the stage? Close to the performer? "In-the-round" - that is in the *center* of the performers?)

- Behind the conductor because that is where he or she is conducting and placing the mic there, would give a surround recording from their point of view. Also, have a mic stand and put it in front of the conductor or in-the-round of the orchestra.

Would you prefer your favorite recordings to be "in surround"?

- I prefer film scores to be in surround because when you watch a film the music can start in stereo although, you can hear the extra sound design effects that give the recording a different experience than hearing in stereo. I prefer listening back to music in stereo, and film scores surround.

When do in-the-round recordings make sense? Are they too "gimmicky"?

- I think it would make sense when the mic is in the center because it gives the mic more opportunities to mix in surround. If the mic is in-the-round it will be easier to mix together since the sound is captured from all directions.
